【麻疹情報】

12月9日,マーシャル政府より当館に対し,今般の麻疹(はしか=Measles) 流行拡大を防ぐための措置の一環として,すべての旅行者に対し,マーシャル 出入国時の麻疹予防接種証明書提示を義務化する旨の通達がありました(別添)。 要点は以下のとおりです。

ご自身の予防接種の履歴や罹患歴を踏まえ、必要な対応を検討してください。マーシャル国内での予防接種にあたっては、マジュロ病院又はクリニックにご相談ください。なお、流行地域やマーシャル政府による予防対策などは、状況に応じて変化する可能性があります。引き続きラジオ、新聞等の最新情報に留意して頂くとともに、万が一、罹患の疑いがある場合には、直ぐに病院で医師に相談してください。

この他, 当地にてインフルエンザが蔓延していますので, この点も併せご留意ください。

(発表内容)

- 1. マーシャル出国時(マーシャル国民及びマーシャル在住外国人のみ)
- (1) 出生から $6\sim1$ 1か月の人は、出国2週間以上前に麻疹の予防接種を受けたという証明書を提示しなければならない。出国時に同証明書を提示できない場合、出国できない。
- (2) 1957年以降に出生し、出生12か月以降の人は、麻疹の予防接種の最新情報証明書、または出国2週間以上前に麻疹の予防接種を受けたという証明書を提示しなければならない。出国時に同証明書を提示できない場合、出国できない。
- 2. マーシャル入国時(2019年12月10日から)
- (1) 1957年以降に出生し、出生12か月以降の外国人訪問者及び航空機乗組員は、搭乗前に、麻疹の予防接種の最新情報を示す、正式で捺印された証明書を提示しなければならない。入国時に同証明書を提示できない場合、入国できず、(マーシャルを飛び立つ)同じ飛行機に再搭乗させられる。
- (2)マーシャル国民及びマーシャル在住外国人は、マーシャル到着時に、麻疹の予防接種の最新情報証明書を提示しなければならない。入国時に同証明書を提示できない場合、14日間自宅隔離され、マーシャル保健省によって予防接種を受けされられる。

INTERNATIONAL TRAVEL ADVISORY (UPDATED)

TO: AIRLINE & VESSEL OWNERS, OPERATORS and/or AGENTS

RE: Protection against Measles Importation into the RMI

The Ministry of Health and Human Services (MoHHS) in the Republic of the Marshall Islands (RMI) has issued an International Travel Advisory (see attached) due to the current measles outbreak occurring in many countries.

If the measles virus is imported to RMI, transmission of measles will spread immediately and rapidly. Therefore, in support of the advisory issued by RMI health authorities dated 05DEC2019, the Division of Immigration is executing its functions and powers in accordance with the Immigration Act, Part XV, \$186(1)(c), requiring the production of documents by any person on any ship, vessel or aircraft in the Republic.

The following measures are to be executed by the specified Effective Dates:

Citizens and Foreign Residents Traveling from RMI - Effective Immediately

Airline & Vessel Owners, Operators and/or Agents are hereby *required* ensure that Citizens and Foreign Residents traveling out of the RMI meet the following requirements before travel can be facilitated. Secondary inspections for these requirements will be executed by Immigration authorities.

Traveler	Requirement	Failure to Produce
Between ages of 6 months to 11 months	Proof of vaccination two (2) weeks prior to travel from health provider	Departure Refusal
Between 12 months of age to adults born on or after 1957	Proof of up-to-date vaccination or vaccination two (2) weeks prior to travel from health provider	Departure Refusal

Travelers Entering the RMI - Effective December 10, 2019

Airline & Vessel Owners, Operators and/or Agents are hereby *required* to ensure that all foreign visitors and non-resident passengers and terminating crew traveling to the RMI meet the following requirements before travel can be facilitated.

Traveler	Requirement	Failure to Produce
Foreign Visitors/Non- Residents and Crew - Between 6 months of age to adults born on or after 1957	PRIOR TO TRAVEL: Official and sealed up-to-date measles vaccination certificate from health provider	Travel/Entry Refusal – airline will be notified, and traveler will be re-boarded on the same flight he/she arrived on.
RMI Citizens and Foreign Residents	UPON ARRIVAL: Proof of up- to-date measles vaccination to health	Will be required to undergo strict home quarantine for 14 days and will be required to be vaccinated by MoHHS.

Craft requirements prior to arrival into any RMI port - Effective Immediately

Prior to the arrival of all crafts into any RMI port of entry an official health alert (attached) is **required** to be read on board for terminated passengers.

In addition to the prescribed RMI Customs Declaration and RMI Immigration Arrival Card (Form 8616-AR) all crafts are hereby *required* to issue the prescribed RMI Health Surveillance Form (attached) to *all* terminating passengers and crew prior to arriving in the RMI at any port of entry whether by air or sea.

Measles International Travel Advisory Protection Against Measles Importation to RMI

The Ministry of Health and Human Services (MoHHS) in the Republic of the Marshall Islands (RMI) hereby issues this **revised** International Travel Advisory due to the current measles outbreaks now occurring in many countries. RMI is highly susceptible to measles introduction due to low immunity coverage of less than 90%, Vitamin A deficiency and stunting in 35% of children under 5. Measles is highly contagious and can spread easily from person to person through the air, via breathing, coughing and sneezing and impacts both children and adults. Every case of measles on average infects 12 to 18 non-immune people exposed to those infected individuals.

If the measles virus is imported to RMI, transmission of measles will spread immediately and rapidly. Therefore, the Ministry is requiring all persons traveling to and from the Republic of the Marshall Islands to abide by the following requirements:

RMI Citizens and Foreign Residents Traveling From RMI – Effective Immediately

- Infants of RMI Citizens and Foreign Residents (6 months of age up to 11 months) travelling internationally are required to be vaccinated against measles two weeks prior to travel. This is called a "zero dose" and is given in addition to two doses of measles containing vaccine at 12 months and 13 months of age to acquire long term protection of 97%. The measles containing vaccine used in the RMI is the MMR (measles, mumps and rubella) vaccine. A copy of the infant's travel document/E-ticket is required to receive this vaccination from Public Health. No exceptions unless contraindicated by a doctor in writing.
- RMI Citizens and Foreign Residents (children 12 months of age up to adults born after 1957) traveling internationally must be vaccinated and up-to-date against measles two weeks prior to travel. A copy of the traveller's E-ticket is required to receive this vaccination from Public Health. Failure to comply will result in exit refusal. No exceptions unless contraindicated by a doctor in writing.

All Incoming Travellers to RMI – Effective December 10th, 2019

 Non-RMI Citizens (6 months of age up to adults born after 1957) must show an official and sealed up-to-date measles vaccination certificate from health provider upon entry to

- RMI ports. This will be an entry requirement for getting into the RMI. Failure to comply will result in entry refusal. No exceptions unless contraindicated by a doctor in writing.
- RMI Citizens and Foreign Residents who do not have evidence of up-to-date measles vaccination or evidence of measles infection in the past will be required to undergo strict home quarantine for 14 days and will be required to be vaccinated by MoHHS. MoHHS will issue medical sick leave forms as needed. No exceptions unless contraindicated by a doctor in writing.
- Persons suffering from contagious disease, and persons who have been exposed to such disease, may be isolated and quarantined in accordance with regulations issued pursuant to Chapter 7 of the Marshall Islands Revised Code Chapter 1 Section 106 of the Public Health and Sanitation.
- All up-to-date vaccinated persons entering RMI will need to "watch and monitor" their own health for 3 weeks upon arrival/return. Measles symptoms typically include:
 - o high fever (may spike to more than 104° F)
 - o cough
 - o coryza or runny nose
 - o conjunctivitis or red, watery eyes
 - o rash (develops 3-5 days after symptoms begin)
- Any travellers who develop these symptoms must seek medical care immediately. Public Health officials contact information will be distributed at the ports of entry. These officials will require the ill patients to inform them of their recent travels to measles affected areas, and these officials will need to know whether or not the travellers received a measles vaccination.

The most effective protection from measles is getting vaccinated. Protect yourself and your loved ones from measles. For further information, please contact the following:
