## Japan celebrated 62<sup>nd</sup> birthday of His Majesty the Emperor of Japan

On February 23, the Embassy of Japan in the Republic of the Marshall Islands hosted a reception to celebrate the 62<sup>nd</sup> birthday of His Majesty the Emperor of Japan at the Marshall Islands Report. The reception was attended by over 150 guests, including His Excellency President David Kabua, First Lady Ginger Kabua, Honorable Members of the Council of Iroij, Honorable Foreign Minister Casten Nemra, Honorable Ministers and Senators, members of the diplomatic corps, government officials, business communities, Japanese-Marshallese community and other invited guests.

Guests were warmly welcomed by the flower arrangements presented by Japanese-Marshallese Mrs. Philomina Asma Muller and enjoyed Japanese sweets displayed on origami sweet boxes on guest tables. Japanese sake brought from northern and southern parts of Japan for this special occasion were also served.

Ambassador TANAKA opened his remark by celebrating the 62<sup>nd</sup> birthday of His Majesty the Emperor of Japan and expressed gratitude to all the guests for advancing the Japan-Marshall Islands friendship.
